Village of Jackson Center Receives Neighborhood Revitalization Grant

Village Administrator Bruce Metz, recently received word that our village will be receiving the Neighborhood Revitalization Grant for \$480,000!

The Community Development Block Grant is a flexible program that provides communities with resources to address a wide range of unique community development needs. This grant has required a lot of meetings, paperwork and community feedback and support. For all the community members that took time to attend meetings and provide their input during the past 2 years, thank you!

Our grant was approved with the \$480,000 allocated to the following: Detention pond \$160,000, Park Improvements/Development \$130,000, and reconstruction of Davis and Linden Street for \$190,000. The timing of the street reconstruction is perfect timing due to the construction of the new school!
